This offering provides exposure to the Massachusetts municipal bond market, seeking to provide Fund shareholders with current income exempt from regular federal income tax and state personal income tax. Fund investments span municipal sectors, with allocations directed by manager, Craig Brandon, since 2010.

The Fund's active management draws upon the expertise of Eaton Vance's municipal bond team, among America's largest and most experienced municipal bond managers. The investment team applies Eaton Vance's credit research process, while implementing a relative-value trading approach to municipal investing.

The Features

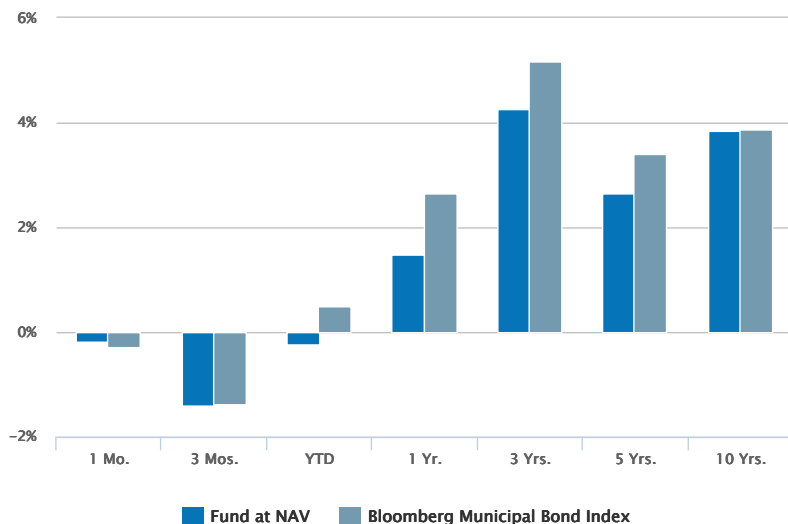

Historical Returns (%)

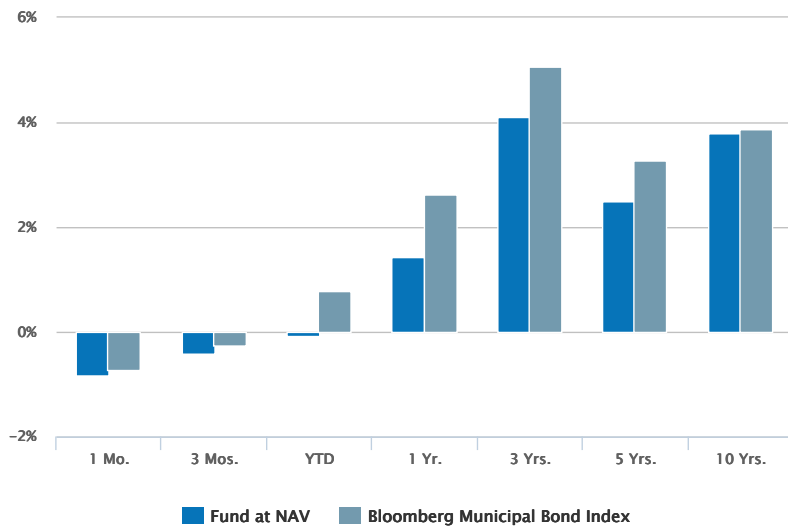

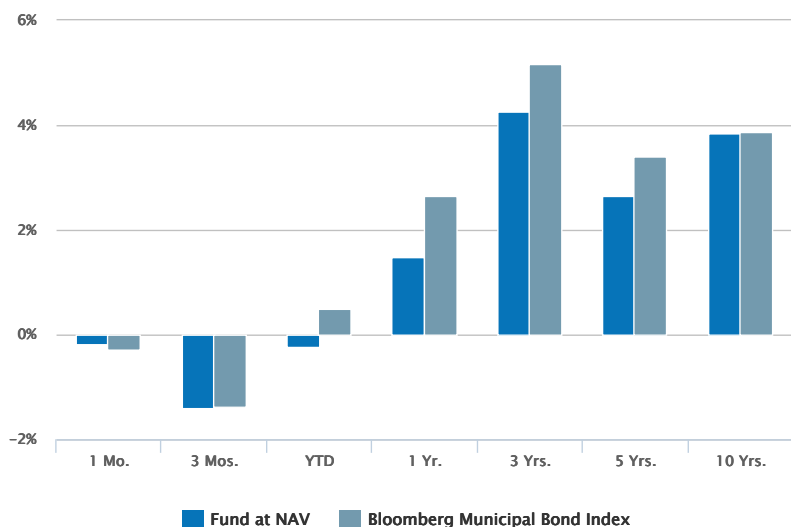

Historical Returns (%)

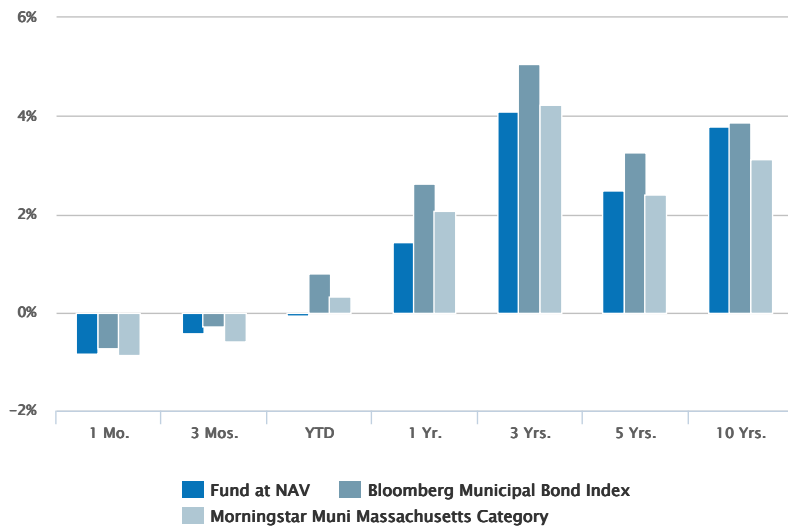

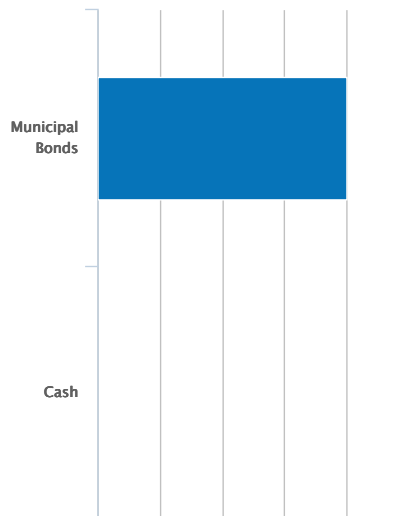

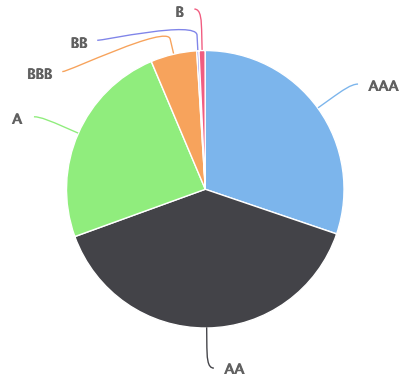

Maturity Distribution (%)¹¹

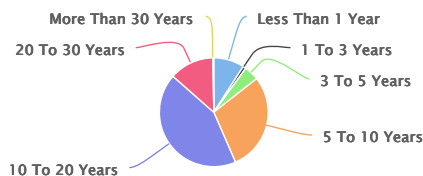
