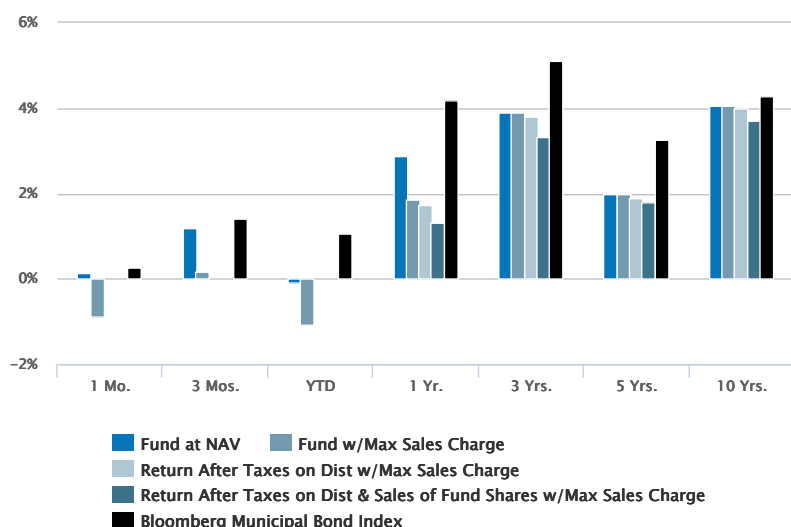

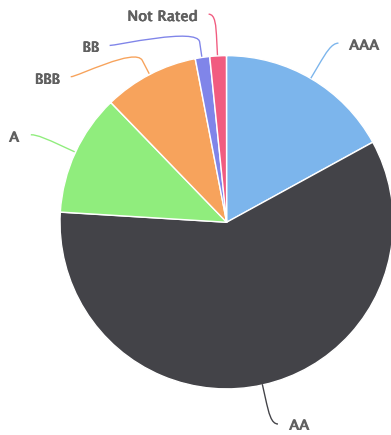

Maturity Distribution (%)¹¹

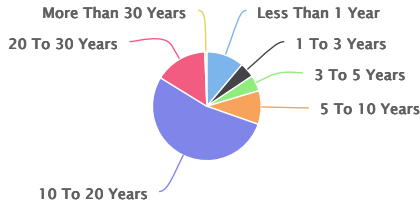
